

### HERE'S WHAT WE KNOW

THE PANDEMIC HAS EXPOSED THE DEEP INEQUITIES IN OUR SOCIETY. THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN (ARP) IS AN UNPRECEDENTED OPPORTUNITY TO USE \$7.3 BILLION TO REBUILD OUR COMMUNITIES AND PUT US ON A PATH TO A JUST ECONOMY.

PA MUST TAKE ADVANTAGE OF THE OPPORTUNITY IT PROVIDES.

### THE ARP AND THE 2021-22 BUDGET

- BILLIONS FOR DEDICATED RELIEF: SCHOOLS, SMALL BUSINESS, RENTERS AND HOMEOWNERS, CHILDCARE, ETC.
- \$7.3 BILLION (AND \$1 BILLION IN OTHER FUNDS)
  TO:
  - MAKE UP FOR LOST REVENUES.
  - RESPOND TO THE CRISIS.
  - ADDRESS LONG-TERM PROBLEMS.

# A CRITICAL CHOICE ABOUT \$8.3 BILLION

- OPTION 1: CLOSE DEFICITS DUE TO THE IMPACT OF THE PANDEMIC ON STATE REVENUES (\$3.8 BILLION) AND INVEST IN PA WITH THE REST (\$4.5 BILLION).
- OPTION 2: USE ALL \$8.3 BILLION TO CLOSE NOT ONLY PANDEMIC-RELATED DEFICITS BUT THOSE CREATED BY IRRESPONSIBLE BUDGET DECISIONS.
  - CORPORATE TAX CUTS THAT HAVE LED TO \$4 BILLION IN LOST REVENUES PER YEAR
  - ONE-TIME REVENUES AND BUDGET GIMMICKS TO "BALANCE"
    THE BUDGET







### STATE GOVERNMENT SPENDING AND EMPLOYMENT HAS DECREASED OVER TIME




### SHARE OF INCOME THAT DIFFERENT GROUPS PAY IN STATE AND LOCAL TAXES

- THE 20% OF PA FAMILIES WITH THE LOWEST INCOMES, AN AVERAGE OF \$13,000, PAY 13.8%.
- THE 20% OF PA FAMILIES WITH INCOMES IN THE MIDDLE RANGE, AN AVERAGE OF \$54,000, PAY 11.1%.
- THE 1% OF PA FAMILIES WITH THE HIGHEST INCOMES, AN AVERAGE OF \$1.6 MILLION, PAY 6%.



# DELAWARE'S STATE AND LOCAL TAX SYSTEM IS RIGHT-SIDE UP



# CORPORATE

- OF ALL THE CORPORATIONS THAT OPERATE IN PA, 73% PAY NO CORPORATE TAXES—AND THEY ARE MOSTLY GIANT, MULTINATIONAL BUSINESSES BASED OUT OF STATE.
- GOVERNOR WOLF IS CALLING FOR CLOSING THE DELAWARE LOOPHOLE.

# CORPORATE

- If we close the Delaware and Cayman Islands loopholes, we can raise almost \$700 million in NEW REVENUES.
- GOVERNOR WOLF IS CALLING FOR CLOSING THE DELAWARE LOOPHOLE, WHICH WOULD GENERATE ABOUT HALF THAT AMOUNT.







### Share of Workers in Each Racial/Ethnic Group that Benefit From a \$15 Wage in 2027





# RAISING THE MINIMUM WAGE TO \$15 IN PA WOULD:

- RAISE THE WAGES OF 1.6 MILLION PENNSYLVANIANS OR 27.5% OF THE PA WORKFORCE.
- ADD \$6 BILLION TO SPENDING, WHICH WOULD SUPPORT LOCAL BUSINESSES.

#### THE FUNDING GAP IN K-12 EDUCATION

- THE FUNDING GAP IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN HOW MUCH SCHOOL DISTRICTS SPEND PER STUDENT AND HOW MUCH THEY NEED TO SPEND TO PROVIDE AN ADEQUATE EDUCATION ACCORDING TO STATE STANDARDS.
- THE AMOUNT NEEDED TO PROVIDE AN ADEQUATE
   EDUCATION WAS DETERMINED BY A PANEL OF EXPERTS
   AS REQUIRED BY A STATE LAW PASSED BY A BIPARTISAN
   MAJORITY IN 2008, UPDATED FOR 2020.

# WHAT GOVERNOR WOLF'S PLAN DOES







#### PENNSYLVANIA PROMISE

#### WHAT IT DOES:

Covers two years of tuition/fees for any recent HS grad enrolled full-time at one of PA's 14 public community colleges;

Covers four years of tuition/fees for recent HS grads with a family income less than \$110,000/year accepted at a State System of Higher Education school;

Provides an additional four years of grants from \$2,000 up to \$11,000, depending on family income, for students accepted into a state-related university;

Provides grants to adults without a college degree, with priority given to those seeking in-demand skills and industry-recognized credentials.

## WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO HAVE AN EXTREMELY LOW INCOME IN PENNSYLVANIA?

EXTREMELY LOW INCOME (ELI): HOUSEHOLDS ARE CONSIDERED "EXTREMELY LOW INCOME" WHEN MEMBERS MAKE 30% OR LESS OF THE AREA MEDIAN INCOME (AMI).

FOR EXAMPLE, HERE ARE 3 COUNTIES IN PA.\*



### **SOLUTION: MAKE HOUSING A PRIORITY**

- PRIORITIZE RENTER SUBSIDIES: THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN HAS RENTER SUBSIDIES, BUT WE NEED TO ADVOCATE FOR THAT MONEY TO GET OUT TO RENTERS EQUITABLY AND EFFICIENTLY AND THAT FUNDING CONTINUE WHEN THE ARP ENDS.
